Endometriosis (pronounced: en-doe-me-tree-O-sis) is a chronic and painful disorder found in the female body, that causes tissue to grow outside of the uterus. According to the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services: "Endometriosis affects 176 Million Women and Girls Worldwide." As we enter into a turning point in healthcare, there are finally more physicians that are recognizing endometriosis for the significant, public health crisis that it is. Sadly, there is still work to be done to educate the public on this condition and the affect it takes on your life.
